<p><b>A visit to the Antonine wall - Thursday afternoon</b>  <i>Professor Bill Hanson will guide a trip to the Antonine Wall fort at Bar Hill, and on to Rough Castle fort where the best surviving section of the Antonine Wall is extant. The Hunterian Museum will also be providing a pop-up museum of Roman artefacts from the excavations on the trip and delegates will also see the Falkirk wheel.</i></p>	<p><b>Glasgow Cathedral and Govan Stones - Friday morning</b>  <i>Adrian Cox and Steve Driscoll will provide insights into Glasgow Cathedral (a medieval cathedral built on the site where St Kentigern, or Mungo, was thought to have been buried in AD 612) and the Govan stones, early medieval carved stones in Govan Old Church linked to those who ruled the Kingdom of Strathclyde.</i></p>
